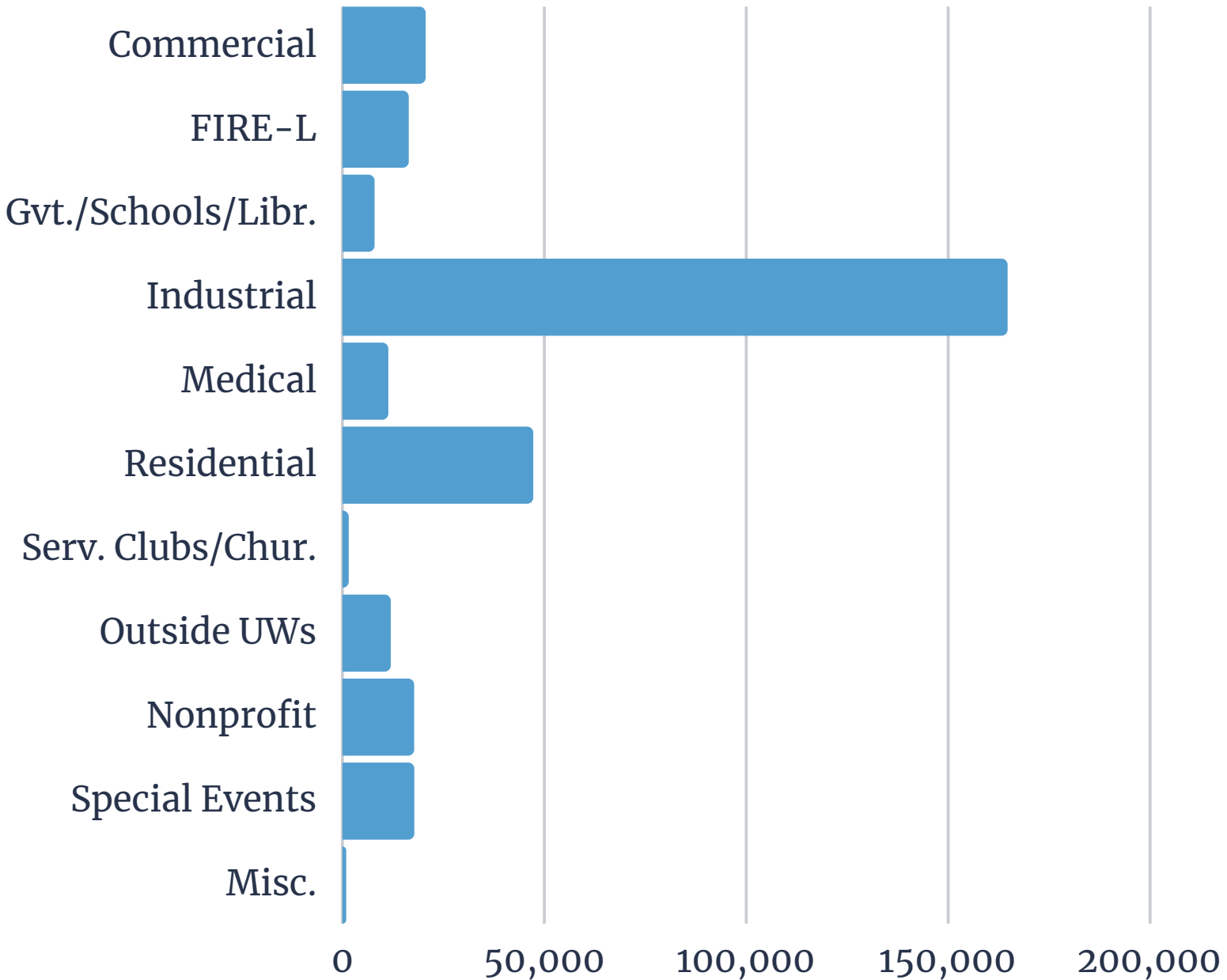

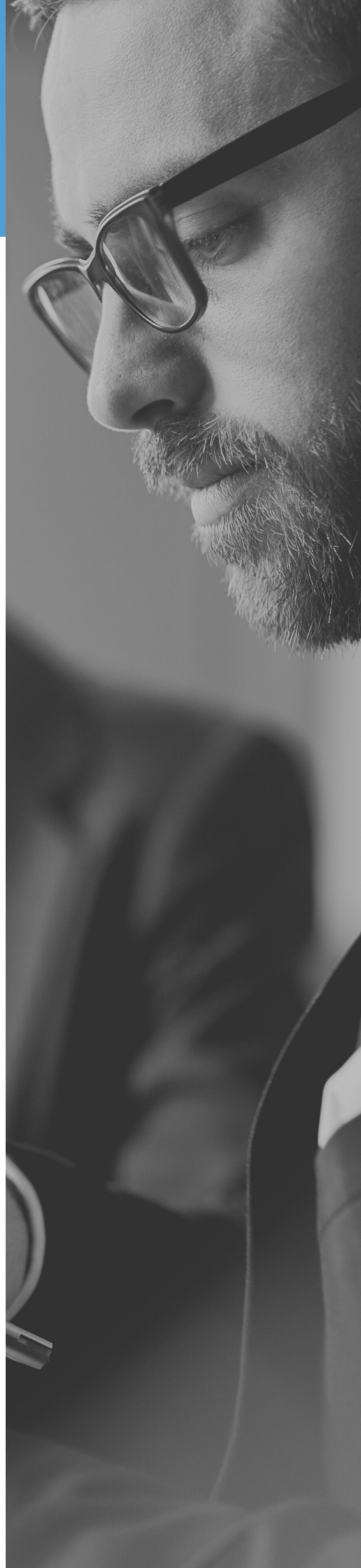

DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY.....\$14.5K

Over 1,000 children in Williams County received a free book a month mailed straight to their homes in 2020. This is our largest internal program and one that addresses literacy and brings families together.

The Ohio Governor's Imagination Library was created to support local efforts for **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library** programs throughout the state. The goal is to enroll 100% of eligible children in the next 3 years.

LET ME PLAY FUND.....\$3K

The "Let Me Play" fund was established in 2003 to provide player's fees, uniform costs, or even equipment to children who would like to participate in area recreation programs, but do not have the means to pay the fees.

WE CARE CABINET.....\$12.5K

We are always ready to lend a helping hand.

The **We Care Cabinet** was founded in 2015 to help local food pantries provide personal care items to those in need. Along with B-Rock Cares and Midwest Community Federal Credit Union, we held monthly *Live Drives* to collect monetary and physical donations to help alleviate the gap in the provision of these essential items.

Personal care items include:

- toilet paper
- bar soap
- body wash
- deodorant
- shampoo & conditioner
- toothbrushes
- toothpaste

MEAT PROCESSING.....\$3K

Anonymous farmers in Williams County donate sows and cows to the United Way of Williams County. We take this meat, pay for the processing, and donate it to the area food pantries for distribution to families and individuals in need.

EMERGING NEEDS.....\$10K

An emergency fund that can be tapped to support Williams County residents in times of crisis.

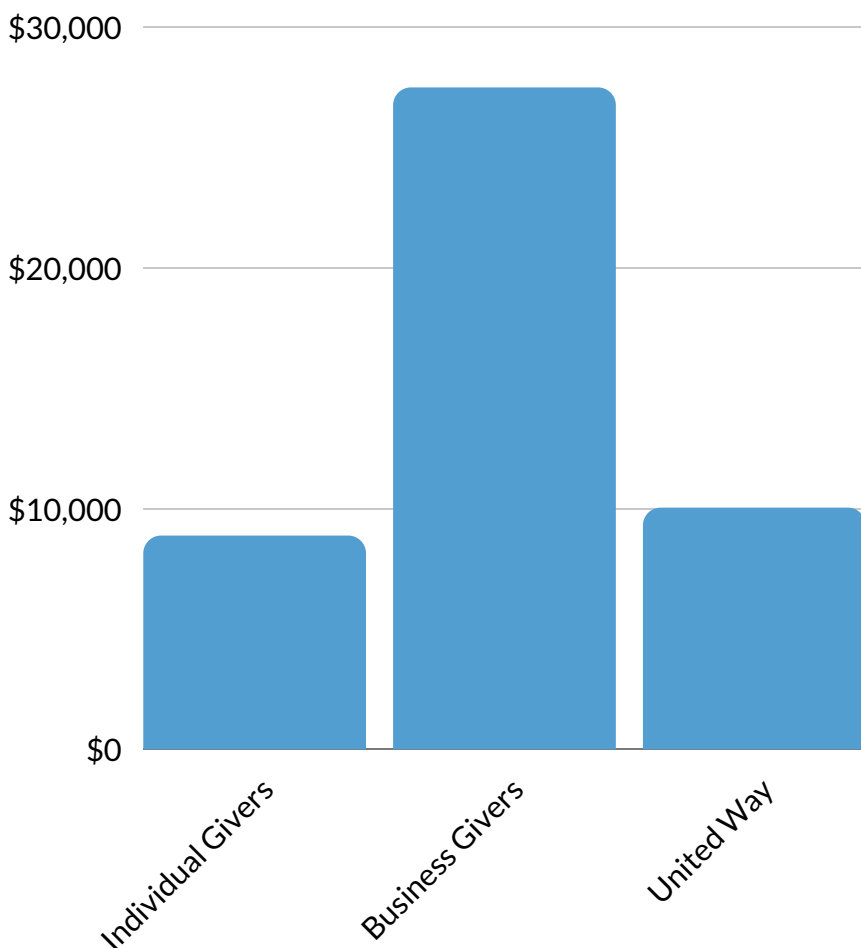
COVID-19 RELIEF FUND
